**Community Wellness** is a one-year project to extend parish nursing services and supports to our community to benefit adults with health challenges. This project will continue to offer holistic health support to Trillium members while representing significant outreach to our community. The start date for *Community Wellness* is February 1st.

Trillium's Health and Wellness Team will direct the Community Wellness project. Besides one-to-one support from our Parish Nurse, the team will organize several Personal Care Clinics offering services like foot care and haircuts at affordable rates and Information Events on health and safety issues. Planning is underway for a session on Internet/Email/Phone Scams.



Many thanks to the Trillium members who have volunteered to help with project events and assist with translation if needed.

Currently, the project is funded by a grant from *Embracing the Spirit*, a United Church of Canada program to support churches in innovative ministries, and by the Trillium Seniors Fund. To fully fund the project, other grants applications are in process.

Help! Our Blessing Bags need your continued support.




A big **THANK YOU** for all the donations to the **Blessing Bags**.





The Mobile Food Market is at Trillium every Tuesday from 5:00-6:30pm. We look forward to seeing you there.



### **Pastor Mark's Musings**

Dear Friends,

I heard the news that Hazel McCallion recently passed away. She was 101 years old. McCallion became famous as the mayor of Mississauga. She served in this role for thirty six years, from 1978 to 2014. When you read about her early years you realize what a humble background she came from. Born in the Gaspe as Hazel Journeaux, her father owned a small fishing and canning company while her mother looked after the family and ran the family farm. McCallion graduated from high school just before WWII and moved to Montreal to attend a secretarial business school.

McCallion was a free spirit from her first days. For one she played professional women's ice hockey during the 1940s earning \$5 per game. She desperately wanted to attend university but her family lacked the resources to send her there. Instead she worked avidly in the business world advancing up through the corporate ladder. McCallion married at thirty which was considered old for her time and had three children. In 1967 McCallion left the business world to devote her life to politics, first as a local leader and later as mayor.

The thing I remember most about McCallion was her indomitable spirit and her passion for living life to its fullest. Even as she aged her energy and commitment to service seemed unlimited. After she retired from politics McCallion accepted the role as Sheridan College's first chancellor and was instrumental in its bid to gain university status. McCallion served on the board of the Greater Toronto Airport Authority and was appointed as head of the Greenbelt Council advisory group until her untimely death. I think it is fair to say that Hazel McCallion never really retired!

One interesting feature of Hazel McCallion that often isn't reported was her passionate Christian faith. She was deeply religious. This religious frame was given to her by her parents. McCallion said, "My faith has always been an important part of my life from my earliest memory. My parents always emphasized the importance of having God in our lives and the responsibility we have to do God's work by helping others." A lifelong Anglican McCallion's form of religion was passed on to her from her family. Her Christian faith was meant to be a way or life or lifestyle and not to be contained only for Sundays.

Hazel McCallion's journey into politics certainly challenged her Christian way of life. How to combine "the need for Christian charity with the constant slings and arrows of political fortune?" "It's difficult, yes, but, thankfully, this is where faith takes over and provides us with the strength we need to carry on," McCallion often used the old adage, "a successful person is one who can lay a strong foundation with the bricks that others throw" to keep herself grounded in living out her Christian faith in a topsy turvy world. As McCallion finished her last term as Mayor she reflected that, "if it weren't for my strong faith, I don't know where I would be. Politics is certainly not for the faint of heart, and it is through my strong faith that I can put things into proper perspective."

Being a political leader of a large, multicultural, multireligious community like Mississauga meant that McCallion often faced tough, difficult and complex issues. She mentioned in an interview that her religious belief was an important touchstone in making complex decisions. "I often call on my faith when making difficult decisions. Putting ourselves in the hands of God provides us with an enlightened discernment about life decisions and helps to draw us closer to him."

I think Hazel McCallion lived a life of passion and devotion. She loved giving her utmost to his highest every step of the way. McCallion created an incredible legacy in the many ways she served her communities. She exemplifies the best of what it means to follow Jesus Christ in the service and care of others. Most importantly, perhaps, Hazel showed us that our aging is no barrier to living out the love of God that awakens and then lives through us. God bless you Hazel!
