

Every spring SC&O decides which two charities Trillium will support through our Special Easter Offering. This year we have chosen:


Life & Work of Trillium: Fire Alarm Upgrade

Health and Wellness Team

The team is busy planning events as part of the Community Wellness project which includes one-to-one support and advocacy by our Parish Nurse, Wellness Talks, and Personal Care Clinic. All these services are available to Trillium members *and* the wider community.

The first Wellness Talk, **Frauds and Scams: How to protect yourself,** was held at Trillium on March 15 with ninety-three people in attendance. Fifty-one attendees were from outside Trillium. A detective, a sixteen-year veteran with the Waterloo Regional Police Service, gave an informative and often alarming presentation about frauds and scams and tips to protect ourselves.

Frauds and Scams Highlights and Tips:

Grandparent scam: An older adult receives a phone call from someone posing as their grandchild, asking for bail money in cash, and that someone will come to the house for the money.

TIP: The police would never send someone to a house for bail money in cash.

Computer Compromise: An email or phone call claiming your computer has a virus and offering to help clean the virus, but they need remote access to the computer.

TIP: ALWAYS initiate the call for help with your computer.

Bank Scam: Call or email from someone claiming to be with your bank, may claim account has been compromised and ask you to update your profile or give credit card number. Email would ask you to click on a link.

TIP: DON'T Engage. Call your bank.

Romance Scam: Meet online with someone who presents as stable and employed but living elsewhere. May take many months to develop a relationship before they ask for a loan.

Identity Theft: This was added to the Criminal Code in 2011. Examples: Theft of your ID cards, hacking into your personal computer, theft of personal information from your garbage.

TIP: KEEP your social insurance card in a safe place, i.e. don't carry it with you. SHRED personal documents before putting them in the garbage.

Social Media (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter). Profile can be hacked and used to ask for money from your contacts.

TIP: DON'T link social media sites. USE different passwords. STORE passwords securely. CHANGE passwords often. Avoid "clicking" on facebook ads. ALWAYS go directly to the site.

Fraudulent Emails: Email from someone you know asking for a loan or gift cards.

TIP: CALL that person on the phone first.

CRA (Canada Revenue Agency) Scam: Caller claims to be with CRA, says you have unpaid taxes, and demands (aggressively) for immediate payment by credit card. This can also be an email with a demand for payment with a link to a fake CRA website.

TIP: Hang up / don't respond. Contact CRA directly.

Advance Payment Schemes: You are selling an item online (e.g. Facebook marketplace). Purchaser

sends a fraudulent cheque in excess of the price and asks you to refund of the difference. Those defrauded often lose the item they shipped and money. (Sellers beware!)

The team is busy organizing its next event, the first Personal Care Clinic.

Community Wellness Funding:

The Generosity Update

When Trillium was formed in 2005, through the combining of savings and the sale of two church buildings, a large savings account was formed called the Trillium Futures Fund (TFF). At its peak the TFF probably had \$1,200,000 in it. Trillium invested about half of this total to make the current building more accessible. Trillium also used money from the TFF to invest in extra staffing and programs. This has led to a decrease in our savings with the TFF sitting today at around \$400,000. There was agreement at Church Council that Trillium needed to be more judicious in using its savings going forward. As Kevin Uebele has mentioned, we want to stop raiding the "cookie jar" for our operating expenses.

At the 2023 Annual Meeting the issue of using the TFF was discussed in some detail. The question was how to keep growing Trillium without raiding the cookie jar. There were many good ideas offered at the Annual Meeting. Several of them are still being worked on by the Generosity Team. The 2023 budget was then approved. The 2023 budget is balanced (revenue equal with expenditures) and keeps programming and staffing at its current levels. As compared with 2022, the 2023 budget includes an 18% increase in congregational givings to support the operations of Trillium. In actual dollar terms, the 2023 budget grows congregational support from \$170,000 to \$200,000. With the extra \$30,000 Trillium will end the year with a balanced budget.

This is a big step up for Trillium. It will require the whole Trillium congregation pitching in. There is simply no way to get to our 2023 totals with only some of the congregation contributing. The simplest solution would be everyone at Trillium raising their financial support for the church by 18%. That would not be a fair approach though. Some people are already giving their financial best in supporting Trillium. Others have a lot of room to grow in their generosity to their church and can go beyond an 18% increase. There is no way for the Generosity Team to give a simple formula to the congregation.

What the Generosity Teams asks is that you prayerfully consider your level of financial support for Trillium. We think Trillium is worth your investment. We think we have an amazing church that has a real future. For the past 15 years we have been tilling the ground and planting seeds. This is the moment, in our estimation, for the whole congregation to join hands with the Risen Christ and push Trillium to a new energetic level. God is alive in our congregation and with the blessing of the Spirit we can make Trillium that Faith in Bloom community that we know in our hearts it can be. Come and join us in an amazing journey of faith.

Ever since I was a little girl awaiting the bagpipes to appear on the parade route, the beating of the drums and the enthusiasm of the crowd, I've loved parades.

So, at this time of year I am filled with excitement thinking about Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. People lined the streets waving palm branches, chanting hosanna, and throwing their garments and palms on the ground to welcome Him. What an incredible spectacle it must have been. The people had been waiting for a King to deliver them from oppression. They expected a political, military powerhouse that would free them from the Romans.

The man that road into town on a donkey, not a stallion, was a Prince of Peace. Jesus came to teach that love, compassion, and grace would change the world not a world ruled with anger, physical power, or revenge.

Some in the crowd would have already experienced Jesus' teachings and known the kind of leader He was. Others lining the streets may have been struck by the simplicity of Jesus' entrance. They were probably saying to themselves, "Who is this guy? Where is the King and Deliverer we are expecting?"

How would you have reacted to Jesus' entrance on a donkey? I think of all of the parades I've attended. I think of the Blue Jays parade in Toronto after they won their second world series in 1993. I think of the Santa Claus parades I watched in my childhood (and later with my children) and many, many more. They all had one thing in common. They were loud and full of joy!

This is the experience Jesus wants us to have. He wanted the crowd to witness pure joy, pure love, and pure acceptance. I'm not sure how I would have reacted to a quiet, humble, gentle man entering Jerusalem on a donkey, but I'm so grateful He did. He set the tone and example for all of us to be the same.

Hosanna and Hallelujah! Praise God for all our blessings!

Pastor Mark's Musings

Dear Friends.

As I have mentioned before, when Albert Einstein published his ideas about General Relativity back in the early part of the 20th century his ideas were met with considerable resistance in the scientific community. In fact, a hundred reputable scientists wrote an open letter "condemning" his scientific proposals. It is interesting that a hundred or so years later Einstein's ideas around time, space and gravity now form part of our essential understanding of how the universe works. Interestingly, his critics, for the most part, have faded into the shadows of history. What was once a contrarian view has become mainstream understanding.

Think about the contrarians who have shaped our world. Nicholas Copernicus wrote his final treatise, De revolutionibus, claiming that the Earth circled around the Sun. Copernicus, in this work, overturned the prevailing view that the Sun circled the Earth and revolutionized our understanding of the universe and how it worked. Interestingly, De revolutionibus was not published until after Copernicus' death because he was deeply concerned about how the public would react. Contrarians are rarely welcomed in their own times it seems.

Back in his day Jesus was considered a contrarian of a certain kind. The Sermon on the Mount found in Matthew, chapters 5 to 7, forms a contrarian view of life. Jesus turns the Jewish law on its head. There are several examples where Jesus says something like "you've heard that it was said" and then offers the presumed way of thinking. He then continues, "but I tell you" and disagrees with us is, nonetheless, our neighbour, our provides a contrarian view that goes far beyond and sometimes against the presumed expectations of his people.

So for instance Jesus says in Matthew 5:38-39,

"You have heard that it was said, 'Eye for eye, and tooth for tooth.' But I tell you, do not resist an evil person. If anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to them the other cheek also."

Jesus then continues to explain his new way of thinking and understanding and its implications for life. He does Pastor Mark this many times in the Sermon on the Mount and at

many points in his ministry. Time after time Jesus challenges the customs and mores of the Jewish people by moving the bar in a different direction.

Jesus didn't always win a lot of friends in high places by his contrarian perspective. In fact, he alienated very powerful people in his pursuit of God's purposes in life. Eventually this led to a final confrontation between Jesus and the religious and civil authority. It was because of this confrontation that Jesus was charged, convicted and executed. This sometimes happens to the contrarian doesn't it?

What makes Jesus a particularly interesting case in the study of the contrarian is that his primary argument to the world was that love should be the principal force that shapes human behaviour and conduct. Jesus insisted that any moral system that doesn't place love as the guiding principle is by nature wrong. Probably most powerfully, Jesus insisted that God is love. God creates and sustains by the power of love. Jesus proclaimed the Kingdom of God which is the Kingdom of Love. This love is given by God graciously to everyone. There is no privilege in the Kingdom of God except to love.

We seem to be living at a time when contrarian voices are reviled, condemned and often silenced. As history has taught us this is not unusual. In fact, this is probably the default way of living in the world. As followers of Jesus we are called to a life rooted in love. Where the world wants to polarize people into warring camps we take the contrarian view that says that the one who brother or sister. This doesn't mean we have to agree on everything but it does mean that we commit ourselves to a civility that is rooted in the love that God has for everyone. This is not an easy walk in life to take. We often feel very passionate about specific issues or situations. The cross reminds us that we must be on guard to the easy step of taking our contrarian neighbour, whoever they may be, and making them into our enemy.
