



The Summer of 2023 has been filled with laughter, adventure, friendship, and snacks!


The Trillium Youth have been busy, and the pictures tell the whole story. There have been 3 very successful food collections, canoeing, kayaking, adventures in the woods, swimming, crafts, and the new Community Family Camps. We have welcomed youth of all ages into our events and activities and it has been a blast. We began the summer with Roller Skating. Mickie was a big help as he helped each new skater onto the rink and helped them to find their confidence. Canoeing with Liz, David, and the Ancient Mariners was a wonderful day. The youth each had an opportunity to paddle up the river while those on shore tried their hands at making ice cream the old fashioned way. Our favorite flavors were sour watermelon and vanilla. The month of August the youth met each Wednesday for a games or adventure evening.

Our first adventure was to make chalk bombs to decorate the front sidewalk. The kids learned that citric acid and sodium bicarbonate have an explosive reaction inside their little containers creating a rocket that left chalk blobs on the sidewalk. There was plenty of laughter that evening. The second week we attempted to go geo-caching. Our lesson the previous Sunday was that sometimes our plans are not God's plans. We learned this fully on our walk as we got lost in the tall grasses and weeds that grow close to the Speed River. We prevailed and persevered to find our way out and back home again. The third week had us meeting for a pool party graciously hosted by Liz and David Reed at their daughter Dianne and Jennifer's home. It was a wonderful time of playing and laughter. We are very grateful to have been invited to swim. The final week of August has the older youth heading to The Core climbing gym to try their hands at bouldering. The younger youth will complete the summer with a trip to the trampoline park. Whew! What summer!

Community relationships are very important to Trillium and families are so busy that they often forget to play together. To respond to this need we created the Community Family Camp. This is a camp that invites families to come out and play together. Family is the term used to describe and relational group be it friends, family or community members wishing to take part. The first week we had a Selfie Scavenger Hunt with 4 teams of 16 people - 6 of whom do not attend Trillium. Week 2 was Musical Mayhem with 20 people - 8 of whom do not attend Trillium. We learned how to play Ukuleles and did some drumming. Week 3 was a STEM Challenge where teams were to build a free-standing structure out of toothpicks and marsh-mallows. Week 4 was old fashioned camp games. We had sack races, egg races and played toss the water balloon. Week 4 was the Amazing Race where teams compete physical and mental challenges in a race against the other teams. Each week had a special snack to reward the campers for their hard work and fun! We hope to continue the Community Family Camps once per month over the winter. We hope to see you all there!

Coming up this fall, the youth will be having a sleep-over at the church on September 9 from 4pm until Sunday after church. FROG games will return the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesdays from 6:00-7:30pm.

## Adult Spiritual Growth

### **Adult Spiritual Growth Team**

#### Alpha@Trillium

In spring 2023, the Adult Spiritual Growth Team (ASG) gathered to discuss the spiritual needs of Trillium. We took a hard look at our programming and the congregational response over the COVID years. We also scanned the horizon to discern what the most pressing needs of Trillium will be over the next decade. We came away with a simple conclusion. Trillium needs to learn how to bring new people into the Christian faith; people who often have little or no Christian background.



We've seen our own families turn away from the church. Our children went to church when they were young and then left. They had children who now have no practical church experience. We are now dealing with a large cohort in our society who have no religious training, no faith fellowship and no understanding of what it means to belong to a church community.

## We might shrug our shoulders at this new reality, but two compelling interests call us to respond with urgency.

Jesus calls us, as his followers, to make disciples of all people. In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus commands his followers to:

"Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always to the very end of the age." Matthew 28:19-20

The early church did exactly that—they took the Gospel out far and wide and made disciples throughout many nations. The call to disciple people in a life of faith is axiomatic of what it means to be the church. A church that doesn't take the evangelistic mission of making new disciples seriously is failing at one of the primary tasks given to it by Christ.

Without a deep and powerful faith in God, human life struggles.

The ASG believes the growing report of anxiety, depression and loneliness in Canada directly results from the decline in the population's religiosity. As people lose faith and belief in a higher power and turn to human solutions, it is no surprise that there comes with it a deep discouragement. God created us for something more than ourselves. He built it right into us. Trillium, like all churches, has the antidote to this growing anxiety, depression and loneliness in our society. It is called the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

**Our dilemma at Trillium?** Most of us don't know how to reach out to people and nurture them in the first steps of a life of faith. This is a problem in the United Church at large as well.

It seems we've lost our ability to be disciples. It didn't used to be that way. Two hundred years ago, our forebears as Methodists were the leaders in bringing to people a simple but accessible way to a life of faith. Preston Methodist Church (the first name for Trillium), back in the mid-1870s, had an awakening of the Holy Spirit that led to an influx of over a hundred new members. Methodists knew how to be disciples. When Pastor Mark was at Ebenezer United Church in Milton, ON there was a similar spiritual explosion. Today, we struggle to nurture the first steps of faith among others. With these issues heavy on our hearts, the ASG Team reflected on how to address belief and discipleship. We immediately thought of the Alpha program. Most of the ASG team had taken part in the Alpha program and found it very illuminating and inspiring.

What makes Alpha such a great program is that it offers a simple but systematic way of introducing the basic tenants of the Christian faith to people.

So here we are. Trillium is embarking on the Alpha program in the Fall of 2023.

**The ASG team considers Alpha@Trillium as a multi-year project.** The first step is to introduce Alpha to Trillium members. The founder of Alpha designed the program foremost to welcome new people into a life of faith, but it is also a great program for long-term members to reflect on what they believe and why they believe it. ASG offers the first program of Alpha, expecting participants to be a combination of current Trillium members and some new seekers. From there, we hope to build a network of invitation that reaches further and further into the community to come and explore what it means to follow Jesus Christ.

Alpha@Trillium runs Tuesday, October 3 to December 12. 6:30pm to 9:00pm. At each session, we share a simple meal together, watch an Alpha video, and meet in small groups for reaction and discussion. The first video title: *Is There More to Life Than This?* 

During worship services in September, ASG members will share more about Alpha, including their lifechanging experiences from participating in the program.

### **Pastor Mark's Musings**

Dear Friends,

We talk a lot at Trillium about the practice of generosity. That should come as no surprise to Trillium members since the very foundation of our faith in Jesus Christ rests on an understanding of God's overflowing generosity towards us. Grace literally means overflowing generosity. God's grace is God's extravagant goodness towards us. The Gospel says that even sin (unlove) and death cannot fully frustrate God's goodness for us. To follow Jesus is to live our lives rooted in the goodness of God. And that means also sharing this blessing with our neighbours.

We are sometimes limited in our understanding of generosity. We tend to frame it principally in financial terms. And of course, financial generosity is an important element of living a truly generous life in response to the goodness of God. How we use our financial resources to serve God and bless our neighbours is an important indication of how serious we are in following Jesus. There is no denying that.

We would, however, be amiss if we only thought of generosity in terms of our use of money. There are so many other ways to practice generosity. It could be how we use our time. When you think about it, time can be even more precious than money. We never get time back. Once spent it is gone. Rick Warren wrote, "When you give someone your time, you are giving them a portion of your life that you'll never get back. Your time is your life. That is why the greatest gift you can give someone is your time."

Think about those moments when someone gave you more time than you expected. Perhaps a doctor sat with you longer than you expected, or a coach gave you some special after class attention or a friend listened to your heartache with care and interest. We remember these times and how important they were to us. They make a big impact on us.

I remember when I got the word that my dad had died and that I had to go from Hamilton to the Mississauga General Hospital to identify his body. It was an incredibly difficult journey to make but my best friend came with me. Just having his presence with me was so reassuring. He gave me a gift that day that was more valuable than money. He gave me his time by being present with me.

You possess the most important commodity out there: your time. By being generous with your time when it matters most you show others what true love looks like and feels like. Love almost begs time to make it real. Our commitment to using our time to serve God's purposes is axiomatic to what it means to follow Jesus. There is no other way to share the Gospel than by committing our time to a higher purpose in life.

I find the selfishness of this world is often revealed in how people prioritize their use of time. In the selfish life of our age people dedicate their time principally to themselves. They organize their time around their own wants and desires. They guard their time as closely as they guard our wallets.

That is not how it is to be with us. In the Kingdom of God time is seen and used very differently than it is the world. We are to use our time to serve love's purpose, not ourselves. In fact, in the Greek New Testament God's time has a totally different word associated with it than the normal time connected with the everyday activities of life. The reason there are two words for time is not so much because there are two forms of time as it is that there are two basic ways to use our time.

When time is given freely it becomes a powerful and generous currency. Whether it is how we serve our customers, our peers, family members, friends, neighbours or classmates, the act of sharing our time is the essential characteristic that distinguishes the Christ follower.
