



In case you were wondering... NO TRESPASSING

A number of people have questioned why the No Trespassing signs were placed on the wall of the outside vestibules of the church. Here are the reasons for this action taken by the Property Committee. As a church, we want to welcome everyone and to assist those in need. We have in the past, allowed homeless people to use our hydro to charge their phones, our hose to access water and the outer vestibules to seek temporary shelter from rain and inclement weather.

Unfortunately, this was being abused by some. Significant messes were left behind on a regular basis and used needles were picked up on a number of occasions. The Montessori owners came to us for help with this situation since it was upsetting the parents as they brought their young children to school and staff arriving alone early in the morning. On one occasion recently, emergency medical assistance was being given as the families walked to the school. Rent from the Montessori school helps considerably in keeping the church open and allows us to continue doing good work for the community.

The signs are also a necessary first step if the police ever need to be involved in situations that church staff can't handle. We understand that this is not the type of message that we as a church wish to convey, however we feel that for the maintenance of our positive relationship with Montessori and the safety of our staff and theirs, this has unfortunately become necessary.

We have a steady group of people coming these days to purchase delicious food!





Social Concerns & Outreach

Special Thanksgiving Offering



This October, Social Concerns and Outreach Team have identified the following initiatives to receive our Special Thanksgiving Offering:

Life and Work of Trillium: The Young Adult Group (which is not funded from our annual budget)

The Young Adult group have been active in taking part in experiences they may not have been exposed to before, at an affordable or no cost to them. They have roller skated, hiked, and kayaked over the summer. Over the winter we will continue this practice but also would like to look at a bible study and ways to give back through volunteer work. Barriers to this plan will be their work schedules and transportation.

We are planning a Gratitude Dinner for Thanksgiving Monday as a way to bring our adult youth and anyone in the church or community together to celebrate a non-colonial time of breaking bread together and community. This is not young adult specific but an inclusive event with this unique group in the forefront.

Outreach: Mayan Mission Trip - Stoves and School Supplies

For the Outreach portion of our Special Thanksgiving Offering, SC&O has chosen to support the outreach trip to Guatemala, being led by Val & Dave Thielking from January 21-29, 2024.

There are 10 people committed to the trip, both from Trillium and from outside, and there is room for more. If anyone is interested, please contact Val. The group will be working with "DIG - Dream, Invest, Grow". They work with the Mayan people in Guatemala who were abandoned by the government and forced to live in the mountains with little support, after the civil war ended in 1995. Their focus is on improving community well-being, education, nutrition, medical facilities and infrastructure.

Trip costs are paid for by participants, all money raised will be used in the Mayan community for much needed things like smokeless stoves, school supplies, school upgrades and additions. Group participants will be making and installing smokeless stoves and purchasing and delivering school supplies while they are there.

Please help us to support this wonderful project.

How to Grow in Faith - Part 2 of 5

2) Grow Your Faith by Putting His Word into Practice

"By faith, Abraham, when called to go to a place he would later receive as his inheritance, obeyed and went, even though he did not know where he was going." Hebrews 11:8 NIV.

•Abraham didn't use his faith to *think about* going where God told him to go, he used his faith to **act in obedience.**

I want to remember Abraham's obedience and follow his example. Has God ever asked you to travel an unknown road to a questionable destination? I want to have the faith of Abraham to go where He asks without question.

•It is possible to go through life without growing your faith. You can read the Bible and talk about it, and even agree with what you read, but never do what it says.

"Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive your-selves. Do what it says." James 1:22.

•Our faith moves us to put it into action, following the examples of Jesus. Show love, mercy, and forgiveness as He did.

Our faith can impact every part of our lives- relationships, jobs, service, and worship. The more you put it into practice, the stronger it gets, and the bigger the harvest you will have. You will see your life change for the better, and your faith increase.

Pastor Mark's Musings

Dear Friends,

I watch a lot of debates and discussions on YouTube. I find the exchange of ideas and the sharing of different perspectives the best way to learn things. It is not a perfect way however. One of the things I have noticed is that speakers often fail to give an accurate picture of the other side's argument. People tend to caricature the position of their opposition and create strawman that they can knock down instead of really, seriously engaging what the other person says.

I was thinking about this a few weeks back when the 1 Million March 4 Children protest in Kitchener was taking place. There was also a counter protest that gathered to protest the protest. I know people who were in one or the other protest. They all had an interesting story to tell. It was certainly an emotional day for anyone who gathered and protested.

My general impression was that neither side was particularly interested in engaging the other side's concerns and points of view. It seemed that the prevailing view was to mischaracterize the other side's concerns and direct ad hominem attacks (attacks against the character of someone) on those they disagreed with. In my own personal experience, the people who went to protest or counter protest were people of good will. They were not people intent on hating others or dismissing the concerns of those who disagreed with them. They simply had an important message to communicate to governments and the world around them.

Is it possible to have sympathy with people who you disagree with? When I listened to people in my circle of friends or acquaintances tell me why they went out to protest I found myself sympathetic to the concerns they raised. Both sides seem to have a real point to make. It got me wondering if there was a win/win outcome to be had out of all this. Could there be a way of addressing both sides' key concerns without trespassing over the concerns of the other side? Don't know for sure but I hope so.

Some faith communities were clearly on the side of the 1 Million March 4 Children while other faith communities were on the side of the Counter Protest. There were even clergy and other faith leaders participating in the day of protest. I wonder if some churches and faith communities had members in the protest and counter protest at the same time.

Do you think that is possible? Imagine a church like Trillium having people in both the protest march and in the counter protest march. That would be a real test for us in our willingness to offer friendship and fellowship to all. It is not easy to live with people we don't agree with. Especially in a voluntary community like a church. Can we support others even when they take a different position to us? I think it would require that we hold something greater that binds us together that is bigger than our differences.

There are lots of issues to fight about today. Transgenderism is simply one of them. There are divisions around land rights, abortion, the war in Ukraine, socialism, private enterprise, family law, legalization of drugs, climate change. I could keep going. Take for instance the question of safe injection sites. I know there are many who support the concept of safe injection sites at Trillium. There are also many at Trillium who don't support it. How do we live with the difference? How do we grow and thrive with the difference? Especially on matters that we feel passionate about.

Personally, I think a congregation is healthier when we have a variety of points of view on the topics of the day. But it would only work in our favour if we could find ways of engaging each other on these kinds of issues. That would mean,

first of all, having respectful conversations. That would mean having a real desire to learn from each other. It would mean that we would have to put aside our desire to be right or to win in order to instead focus on understanding each other's point of view. That is not easy. We talk about loving our neighbour at Trillium but when it comes down to the crunch of things it is not an easy practice to actually bring about.

My dream for Trillium is a community filled with passionate people who don't always agree on the practical matters of life but who are still bound to each other because they worship the God who comes in Jesus Christ. Trillium would be a place where people know and experience a love that transcends the differences of this world so that we could then live comfortably in our differences. We might not completely understand each other's idiosyncrasies and points of view but we could still love each other with the love that God loves us with. In that kind of community, the peace of God would be something really powerful to experience
