Since November 2022, Trillium has hosted the Mobile Food Market, a program offered by the Cambridge Food Bank.

While retail grocery store prices continue to be high, having access to affordable fresh produce is important for many people in our community. By shopping at the Mobile Food Market, you can save 30-40% off retail pricing on a basket of fresh produce.

Baskets are \$10 each. If your basic needs are at risk, you may pay a minimum fee per basket, which is \$5.00, or more.

Everyone is welcome. You can support the program by paying more than the suggested price.

The market runs every Tuesday from 5 to 6pm. Volunteers are essential to the program and several Trillium members have willingly given their time. If you wish to volunteer to help at the Mobile Food Market, please contact Wanda Brain.

Adult Spiritual Growth Team



The team's focus for spiritual growth in 2024 is the Alpha Course, an in-depth exploration of the Christian faith—the evidence on which we base our faith and how we can have a closer relationship with God. The spring session at Trillium started April 4 and runs until June 13.

Each weekly session starts with a meal, followed by an Alpha video addressing a different question about faith each week. Group discussion concludes the session. Video topics/

discussion include: How Can I have Faith? Why did Jesus Die? Why and How Do I Pray? How Does God Guide Us? The course includes a retreat on May 17 and 18 to explore the role of the Holy Spirit in our lives.

There are nine participants in the course organized and led by a leader team including: Sally White, Selma Webster, Janice Schultz, Dawn Sebastion, Brian Hershey, Mark Rutledge and Ruth Thompson.

Adult Spiritual Growth Team wishes to thank the over 25 volunteers who are making meals, doing kitchen clean up and serving as greeters. This is truly a church wide effort.

Health & Wellness Team

Health and Wellness Team

In April, the team organized two Personal Care Clinics as an outreach to our community. On April 3rd we held our first off-site clinic at Preston Heights Community Centre. The clinic provided six foot care appointments, five haircuts, and four therapeutic massages. Several residents in the Preston Heights neighbourhood accessed the clinic and appreciated the convenience of having a clinic close to home.

On Friday, April 26th, the team held a clinic at Trillium just for foot care because of the HUGE wait list for this service. There is a shortage of affordable foot care services locally and other clinics have been trying to refer people to Trillium clinics. The team continues to seek funds to increase the number of clinics we can offer to meet the growing demand.

Sally White, Trillium's Parish Nurse, attended both clinics offering blood pressure checks and informal health checks, another way clinics reach out and serve others with kindness.

The clinics continue to attract new people from our community. Everyone who accessed April 3rd and April 26th clinics were from the community outside Trillium's membership.

What should you do if you miss a dose?

Medicines are essential because they help cure, halt, or prevent diseases as well as ease symptoms of an illness. However, they cannot do their job if not taken regularly.

What to do if you miss a dose is dependent on the medication you take. Be sure you look at the medication handout specific to the medication you take or you can look at the drug library on SafeMedication.com for the specific medication you take.

- In general, if you miss a dose of your medication, take the missed dose as soon as you remember, then continue your regular schedule. If you are closer to the next dose, skip the missed dose and return to your standard time.
- Be aware that you should not take extra doses of the medication simultaneously. However, this may depend on the medication you are taking, and there may be instances in which you may be required to double up on your medication or skip the dose all together.

If you are uncertain on how to handle a missed dose call your doctor or pharmacist.

Power Up Ponderings

Trillium is a truly welcoming church – more than just a church – a community. Over the years, we have welcomed many people from our community in Preston to those who have come to Canada to find a new home and new experiences. Over the past year, we have had the pleasure of meeting several students from India who have joined our Trillium community in worship. In March, a team was formed to discuss the needs of the immense population of international students who pass by our doors on a daily basis. Many of whom are Christians living far from their place of birth. There are also many of these students who do not have a relationship with God but are seeking a connection. After meeting one day after church, we decided to embark on a new ministry at Trillium – Youth Ignite.

In India, a youth is defined as 18-30 years of age – what Canadians would identify as a young adult. The experience of church in India for this age group is different. There is more engagement and study. After much collaboration, Trillium offered the first Youth Ignite on April 3, 2024, from 4-6 pm. We had very few expectations and put our full trust in God. We prayed that God would lead us and that we would listen and follow. God never disappoints. At 4 pm on April 3 we had one person arrive. We welcomed our new friend and again placed our trust in God that those who were seeking might be led to our doors. We began the games at 4:30 with about 10 people – 7 of whom were Trillium congregants and staff. By the end of the game, about 20 minutes later, we were joined by 10 students. Praise God! *Sthothiram (Tamil)*

The service was a mix of music, prayer, message, and spiritual practice. The theme was "Play". The need for play in our lives. We talked about how Jesus played, how God plays, and how play can affect our spiritual, emotional, and physical health. We finished the service by playing Eye Spy. The focus was on opening our senses to the world around us – the world that God gave us.

The Youth Ignite team has committed to engaging in this new ministry for six months. While the poster says this service is for Internationals aged 18-35, it is open to all who wish to experience an alternative form of worship. As with most events, volunteers are needed. If you have a passion for expanding our Trillium community in this way, please consider being a part of the Youth Ignite team. Come and experience this service to learn more.

Pastor Mark's Musings

Dear Friends,

I have noticed a growing trend developing in our culture. When a person dies there is often nothing done today to celebrate their life. No funeral, no wake, no gathering of any type is held. A person just simply disappears after they die without any kind of celebration or commemoration.

I think this is a sad development and the number one reason it troubles me is that every life deserves to be celebrated in one form or another (with possibly a few exceptions.) Even difficult or morally suspect people have redeeming qualities that deserve to be lifted up. Giving thanks for another person's life I think says a lot about the culture that we live in and its very absence speaks poorly of where are going.

There are a number of reasons for this shift in our culture. The cost of funerals and memorials can be substantial. Certainly the declining religiosity of our culture has something to do with it. I also think that many in our culture have become disdainful of our past. We are tearing down or removing our historical markers at an alarming rate. The past is not valued very highly in many circles. Of course, people are the living connection with the past and when they die our connection dies with them. If we value this connection, then it becomes incumbent upon us to lift it up in a form of celebration. If we don't value this connection with the past, then of course we won't see it as something worth celebrating when the moment comes to us.

Today, you cannot rely on your children to necessarily organize a celebration of life for you after you've died. It is a sad reality but it is true. We have seen many notable senior members from Trillium over the past five years, who when they pass away, do not receive any kind of meaningful celebration of life. I would highly encourage you to have a direct conversation with your family members about what you would like to see happen as an immediate response to your death. If necessary, you should put in your will if you are not convinced that they will do the "right" thing. You may feel that it is presumptuous to insist on a celebration of life for yourself but this practice goes way beyond your life or death. This is about a deeper set of values and the importance of giving thanks to those who have gone before us. Making your family do the right thing is good for them and will bless them even if in the moment it is not something that comes naturally to them.

On a related note, Trillium is going to embark on collecting emergency contact information for our members. What we are finding at this time is that with families spread out a lot more and people living longer that when someone has a health emergency we have no way of tracking that person down and finding out about their circumstances. A person disappears and we don't know who to contact to find out about them. With an emergency contact number for every member, especially our single seniors, if they disappear from view we can reach out to their emergency contact and find out what is happening in their life.

One of the ways we live our faith at Trillium is staying connected to each other. That means staying connected to our past and it means staying connected to each other today. By doing this in love and with great care we live out God's command to love each other.
